NATIONAL FALLEN FIREFIGHTERS MEMORIAL WEEKEND WILL HONOR AND REMEMBER 144 FIREFIGHTERS *Ten Texas Fallen Firefighters Among the 144 Being Honored on May 6-7, 2023*

EMMITSBURG, Md. – The National Fallen Firefighters Foundation (NFFF) will host the **42nd National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Weekend** (Memorial Weekend) on May 6-7, 2023 in Emmitsburg, Maryland. This year's national tribute will honor 79 firefighters who died in the line of duty in 2022 and 65 firefighters who died in previous years.

Each firefighter's name will be inscribed on a bronze plaque and become a permanent part of the National Memorial in honor of their sacrifices. The honorees will include the following Texas firefighters:

[Driver Engineer Gerald Becker](#), age 62, of the Plano Fire Department, died on 3/12/2020, due to complications of melanoma cancer that metastasized to his liver and brain.

[Fire Chief Curtis Brown](#), age 51 and Firefighter Brendan Torres, age 19, of the Dalhart Volunteer Fire Department, were returning from a mutual-aid traffic accident on 10/4/2022 when they were involved in a motor vehicle collision with a semi-tractor trailer. Both were pronounced dead at the scene.

[Firefighter Hunter Coco](#), age 21 and his brother, **[Assistant Chief Jonathon Coco](#)**, age 25, of the Maxwell Community Volunteer Fire Department, were returning from the scene of a wildland fire in a brush truck on 6/20/2022, when the driver of a privately owned vehicle failed to yield and was struck by the truck. The brush truck rolled over, killing both Firefighter Coco and Assistant Chief Coco.

[Captain Charles Krampota](#), age 60, of the Alvin Volunteer Fire Department responded to a mobile home fire on 9/23/22. He returned home after the fire was extinguished and the scene was cleared. He was discovered deceased at home approximately 3 hours later.

[Firefighter Jose Negrete](#), age 30, of the Copperas Cove Fire Department, died on 7/28/2020, due to complications of lymphoma, deemed by the State of Texas to be in the line of duty.

[Captain Randal Robinson](#), age 64, of the Fort Worth Fire Department, died on 12/17/2020 due to complications of COVID-19.

[Captain Erik Segura](#), age 45, of the Laredo Metro Fire Department, died on 1/26/2021 due to complications of COVID-19

[Firefighter William Wimberly](#), age 71, of the Yoakum Volunteer Fire Department, died on 3/15/2022, due to a ruptured abdominal aortic aneurysm within 24 hours of responding to a motor vehicle accident, where he directed traffic until the scene was cleared.

EVENTS:

There are **two events open to the public** at the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Park on the grounds of the National Emergency Training Center during Memorial Weekend.

- The **National Fallen Firefighters Candlelight Service** is on May 6 at 7:30 pm ET and will be hosted by Fire Captain Garon Mosby of the St. Louis Fire Department.
- The **National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service** is on May 7 at 10:00 am ET and will be hosted by journalist Hillary Howard.

There are also events during Memorial Weekend **provided exclusively for the families and fire departments** of honored firefighters. These include small group sessions and other activities throughout Friday and Saturday; they are open to the families and coworkers of newly honored and previously honored firefighters. The weekend is a time for sharing, healing, and commemorating each firefighter's commitment to public duty.

U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security Alejandro N. Mayorkas is scheduled to address the thousands of attendees at the Memorial Service on Sunday, May 7. At the Memorial Service, the NFFF presents each family with an American flag that has flown over the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial and the U.S. Capitol, a badge, and a rose.

LOCAL PARTICIPATION

Those not attending Memorial Weekend in person can also **pay tribute to this year's honored firefighters**. The public can participate in [Light the Night for Fallen Firefighters](#) (May 4 – 7) by lighting their homes, businesses, landmarks, or fire departments with red lights. Other ways to remember these firefighters include [Bells Across America](#), [Sound the Sirens](#), and by signing the virtual [Remembrance Banner](#).

In addition, the **American flag will be lowered to half-staff on all Federal buildings on Sunday, May 7**. The public is also encouraged to lower their American flags that day to recognize the men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice.

Memorial Weekend is supported by individual and corporate donors, a grant from the **Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Assistance** and in partnership with the **U.S. Fire Administration**, a component of the **Department of Homeland Security**.
