NATIONAL FALLEN FIREFIGHTERS MEMORIAL WEEKEND WILL HONOR AND REMEMBER 144 FIREFIGHTERS

Five Washington Fallen Firefighters Among the 144 Being Honored on May 6-7, 2023

EMMITSBURG, Md. – The National Fallen Firefighters Foundation (NFFF) will host the **42nd National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Weekend** (Memorial Weekend) on May 6-7, 2023 in Emmitsburg, Maryland. This year's national tribute will honor 79 firefighters who died in the line of duty in 2022 and 65 firefighters who died in previous years.

Each firefighter's name will be inscribed on a bronze plaque and become a permanent part of the National Memorial in honor of their sacrifices. The honorees will include the following Washington firefighters:

[Firefighter Michael Bieniek](#), age 62, of the Grays Harbor Fire District #10-Wishkah Fire Department died on 09/02/2021 due to complications of COVID-19.

[Firefighter/Paramedic Joseph Killian](#), age 56, of the Clark County Fire District #6, died on 1/8/2022 from complications of cancer, deemed by the state of Washington to be in the line of duty.

[Engineer/Paramedic Chadwick "Chad" Mittleider](#), age 52, of the Aberdeen Fire Department, died on 12/2/2021 due to a heart attack within 24-hours of a shift during which he responded to multiple emergency medical calls and an arson call.

[Firefighter Blake Nelson](#), age 36, of the Naches Fire Department Yakima County Fire District #3, died on 10/22/2021 due to complications of COVID-19.

[Firefighter Daniel Patterson](#), age 53, of the Spokane Valley Fire Department, responded to multiple calls during his 24-hour shift that ended on 7/21/22. After his shift he went for a run from the fire station. He collapsed outside the fire station where he was found by the on-duty crew. He was transported to the hospital where he was placed on life support until his death on 8/4/22.

EVENTS:

There are **two events open to the public** at the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Park on the grounds of the National Emergency Training Center during Memorial Weekend.

- The **National Fallen Firefighters Candlelight Service** is on May 6 at 7:30 pm ET and will be hosted by Fire Captain Garon Mosby of the St. Louis Fire Department.
- The **National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service** is on May 7 at 10:00 am ET and will be hosted by journalist Hillary Howard.

There are also events during Memorial Weekend **provided exclusively for the families and fire departments** of honored firefighters. These include small group sessions and other activities throughout Friday and Saturday; they are open to the families and coworkers of newly honored and previously honored firefighters. The weekend is a time for sharing, healing, and commemorating each firefighter's commitment to public duty.

U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security Alejandro N. Mayorkas is scheduled to address the thousands of attendees at the Memorial Service on Sunday, May 7. At the Memorial Service, the NFFF presents each family with an American flag that has flown over the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial and the U.S. Capitol, a badge, and a rose.

LOCAL PARTICIPATION

Those not attending Memorial Weekend in person can also **pay tribute to this year's honored firefighters**. The public can participate in [Light the Night for Fallen Firefighters](#) (May 4 – 7) by lighting their homes, businesses, landmarks, or fire departments with red lights. Other ways to remember these firefighters include [Bells Across America](#), [Sound the Sirens](#), and by signing the virtual [Remembrance Banner](#).

In addition, the **American flag will be lowered to half-staff on all Federal buildings on Sunday, May 7**. The public is also encouraged to lower their American flags that day to recognize the men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice.

Memorial Weekend is supported by individual and corporate donors, a grant from the **Department of Justice’s Bureau of Justice Assistance** and in partnership with the **U.S. Fire Administration**, a component of the **Department of Homeland Security**.
